#### 1.4 DECLARATION OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS, SIGNIFICANT NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS AND LESS THAN SIGNIFICANT NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

The provisions of Chapter 14 of the Local Government Act, 1993 (the Act) regulate the way in which Councillors and designated staff of Council conduct themselves to ensure that there is no conflict between their private interests and their public role.

The Act prescribes that where a member of Council (or a Committee of Council) has a direct or indirect financial (pecuniary) interest in a matter to be considered at a meeting of the Council (or Committee), that interest must be disclosed as soon as practicable after the start of the meeting and the reasons given for declaring such interest.

As members are aware, the provisions of the Local Government Act restrict any member who has declared a pecuniary interest in any matter from participating in the discussion or voting on that matter, and requires that member to vacate the Chamber.

Council's Code of Conduct provides that if members have a non-pecuniary conflict of interest, the nature of the conflict must be disclosed. The Code of Conduct also provides for a number of ways in which a member may manage non pecuniary conflicts of interest.

It is recommended that Councillors now disclose any conflicts of interest in matters under consideration by the Council at this meeting.

The Director Technical Services commented that it continues diversion from landfill, we do not have a viable economic use for mixed recyclables at this time.

#### BACKGROUND

In February this year, Russian forces invaded Ukraine. Since then, 13,212 civilians have been killed or injured (more than 5,500 fatalities and more than 7,600 people injured).

It has resulted in the largest refugee crisis since the Second World War. More than 3.4 million Ukrainians have fled the country.

Orange City Council currently has Sister City relationships with four cities. Given the Ukrainian people are in the midst of a war, establishing a Sister City relationship is not appropriate.

However, by selecting a Ukrainian city for a Friendship City, Orange City Council can demonstrate our ongoing support for the people of the Ukraine.

The success of relationships such as this generally relate to community member to community member connections. For example, the Ushiku relationship thrives on Orange community members (schools) having connections with schools in Japan.

One option could be to make connections with Ukrainians who have relocated to this region but obviously still have strong connections to Ukraine. The timing of this contact would need to be managed carefully so as not to further burden our new residents.
