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1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 DECLARATION OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS, SIGNIFICANT NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS AND LESS THAN SIGNIFICANT NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

The provisions of Chapter 14 of the Local Government Act, 1993 (the Act) regulate the way in which Councillors and designated staff of Council conduct themselves to ensure that there is no conflict between their private interests and their public role.

The Act prescribes that where a member of Council (or a Committee of Council) has a direct or indirect financial (pecuniary) interest in a matter to be considered at a meeting of the Council (or Committee), that interest must be disclosed as soon as practicable after the start of the meeting and the reasons given for declaring such interest.

As members are aware, the provisions of the Local Government Act restrict any member who has declared a pecuniary interest in any matter from participating in the discussion or voting on that matter, and requires that member to vacate the Chamber.

Council's Code of Conduct provides that if members have a non-pecuniary conflict of interest, the nature of the conflict must be disclosed. The Code of Conduct also provides for a number of ways in which a member may manage non pecuniary conflicts of interest.

It is recommended that Committee Members now disclose any conflicts of interest in matters under consideration by the Finance Policy Committee at this meeting.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides information for Council so they can make a resolution in regard to three applications for funding through the Small Donations & Grants program. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

We began with Glenroi Heights Public School and Bowen Public School, our sister school and today we now have five schools involved in Wula Gurray, Voice of Change including Orange East Public and Bletchington Public School and Canobolas Rural Technology High School

Wula Gurray is connecting schools together, gaining and building relationships and courage within ourselves to become stronger and to stand proud.

This enables our children to grow stronger and smarter for future generations, by bringing other schools and community together.

Wula Gurray, Voice of Change Choir are seeking a donation for a uniform for the students to wear, standing Strong, Smart and Proud as one. The uniform will consist of 30 polo shirts, with the addition of an artwork design for the shirt, designed by the girls in the choir. Cost of the shirts are \$51.70 each.

This year the choir have performed at the Orange City Council Citizenship Ceremony and this will now be a yearly event for the choir. We have sang at the NAIDOC opening of an art exhibition for Nyree Reynolds. We now have scheduled performances for the school eisteddfod, at the five schools involved at their assemblies, Public Schools Orange Performing Arts Project, NAIDOC opening at the Orange Health Service, NAIROC and Orange Local Aboriginal Lands Council new premises opening day.

This is giving the choir many opportunities to perform at local community events. Their performances are always moving and connect with community members and as a result we are receiving more requests to perform. Having these shirts as a uniform will tie the choir members together, giving them ownership and being recognised as Wula Gurray, Voice of Change in the community.

Participant trophies and a memory CD with all photos and videos will also be provided at a total cost of \$449.

The Orange Eight Day Games is an annual event held in Orange and surrounding areas for 8 days during November. We give the opportunity to individuals to try their hand at many sports & activities around the city using council grounds, sporting clubs and community organisations primarily. There are no restrictions on our event with the only stipulation competitors must be over 18 years of age. In recent years we have had competitors in their mid-70's successfully complete the week.

Six years ago, we added another category, offering people with disabilities the opportunity to join us for the week where they could participate in activities not normally easily accessible to them. This was a great success with everyone competing together and competitors building friendships during the course of the week, that continue to remain strong at the completion of the weeks end. It is something we will be continuing moving forward each year moving forward.

The 2022 Committee has started preparations for this year's event to be run between Saturday 19th November through until 26th November with all clubs and organisations we've used in the past excited to have us back. After missing the 2020 year due to the Covid pandemic we ran the event last year with competitors (20 in each category King nd Queen) with the plan to increase to 25 King and Queen entrants as well as our parasports events.

This will be the 45th running of the Orange Eight Day Games King and Queen Sport event and allows entrants to participate in activities they normally wouldn't attempt.

We are an event that prides our ourselves on inclusiveness and with the ongoing challenges of mental health challenges in the community we feel our community event is a positive for participants whether vounteers or competitors to make new friendships and do something different.

Council logo/branding can be promoted at any available opportunity. Each year the Mayor or delegate of Council is invited to speak at the presentation night on Council's behalf and announce the King and Queen of Sport Winners. Place-getters in each division receive prizes for their achievement and each year this varies depending on the sponsorship income. Gaining this additional funding from Council means the costs of running the event are not passed on directly to the competitors and this sponsorship can contribute to the promotion and administration of the event.
