# 1 INTRODUCTION

# 1.1 DECLARATION OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS, SIGNIFICANT NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS AND LESS THAN SIGNIFICANT NON-PECUNIARY INTERESTS

The provisions of Chapter 14 of the Local Government Act, 1993 (the Act) regulate the way in which Councillors and designated staff of Council conduct themselves to ensure that there is no conflict between their private interests and their public role.

The Act prescribes that where a member of Council (or a Committee of Council) has a direct or indirect financial (pecuniary) interest in a matter to be considered at a meeting of the Council (or Committee), that interest must be disclosed as soon as practicable after the start of the meeting and the reasons given for declaring such interest.

As members are aware, the provisions of the Local Government Act restrict any member who has declared a pecuniary interest in any matter from participating in the discussion or voting on that matter, and requires that member to vacate the Chamber.

Council's Code of Conduct provides that if members have a non-pecuniary conflict of interest, the nature of the conflict must be disclosed. The Code of Conduct also provides for a number of ways in which a member may manage non pecuniary conflicts of interest.

The Orange Classic Motorcycle Club is part of the NSW Classic and Enthusiasts Motorcycle Club. The local Branch has been in operation since 1980 and has supported a number of charitable organizations' over the years with funds raised from its annual bike rally, which attracts over 120 participants each year, who stay at the campsite or in Orange town accommodation for the weekend. In particular, the Club's association with Scouts and the Canobolas Scout Camp has been on going. Using profit from the Rally, it has in the past built the toilet block, the veranda on the Charlie Gunner Building as well as provided cladding and labour to re-clad the dormitories. In addition, we have over the year purchased folding dining tables and utensils such as urns etc.

In addition to supporting local charities, the club purpose is to promote the preservation of historic motorcycles', to promote safe riding and educate its members in the skills and technology required to preserve motorcycles, to provide social opportunities members, with three rides a month planned and participation in other Club rallies. The social benefits gained by its members cannot be underestimated.

Use of the donation: Since the hand-back of the Canobolas Scout Camp, we have had to pay Council Fees, so that any "profit" made is minimal and the cost is ever increasing to hold the rally. This donation will assist us continue to offer the rally each year and ensure continued participation, bringing benefits to the community as outlined below. The Rally is one of the most well attended and long lasting on the NSW Rally circuit. Prior to the hand back of the Scout Camp to Council, , we provided in-kind support to the maintenance and development of the Scout Camp as outlined above in "Description and Purpose".

#### **BENEFIT TO ORANGE**

Each year the Rally brings well over 120 riders to the town who stay over the weekend and often longer, using a range of accommodation, including the Council caravan park. This brings significant financial benefit to the town, as well as promoting the tourism aspects of the local community. Local schools benefit very year. These are engaged to provide morning tea and lunch, and generally make a profit of approximately \$1500 - \$2000. Each year the route of the ride varies, so a whole range of different schools are involved, public we promote local businesses through our annual presentation dinner. In the past, any profit has been donated to charities, for example, Ronald McDonald House. This no longer occurs, since we pay Council fees. The club participates in local events, providing displays such as Australia Day in Cook Part and Grono Bas. The Club has made visits on requests to a rumber of our local retirement homes to support and provide interest to its elderly citizens. The Club has made visits on requests to a rumber, shorth and effenale, who cover a range of ages, but with a significant number of retired members, through rides and social gatherings and sharing of technical skills and equipment.

That Council adopt the fee to hire out the inflatable obstacle course at of cost of \$200 per hour for private use and for the hire of the Orange Youth Hub at a cost of \$12.50 an hour ex GST (plus cleaning fees where applicable).

### FURTHER CONSIDERATIONS

2.2 Fees and Charges Amendments - Orange Aquatic Centre and Orange Youth Hub - Post Exhibition

## SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Council provides a number of services as part of its operations which the Community seek to hire from time to time.

The Aquatic Centre and the Youth Hub have both been approached by community and private organisations for private use or as a venue.

The Aquatic centre have been requested to provide an option to privately hire out the inflatable obstacle course to be utilised within and under control of the Aquatic centre. The proposal comes following public requests to hire the equipment out for private use within the Orange Aquatic Centre. Requests have been received from members of the public, Schools as well as Sporting groups and organisations.

The Orange Youth Hub has received requests to hire the building for a variety of community and private uses such as provision of a literacy program or meeting space.

This report seeks to adopt fees to enable these facilities to be hired.

# Orange Aquatic Centre

Orange Aquatic Centre currently offers the use of the inflatables obstacle course at peak user times for an additional cost of \$5 per person on top of the set pool entry fees.

Orange Aquatic Centre has reviewed other Aquatic Centres that offer the hiring out of the inflatables equipment on a private basis and found it to be popular with the Community.

The proposed \$200/hr fee includes the time for staff to set up and pack down the equipment as well as the required staff to supervise the safe usage of the inflatable obstacle course.

During the reserved hour, the inflatable course will be exclusively available to the hiring group. After this time, the course will reopen for use by all pool patrons in accordance with inflatables operating times.

All users in the hiring group must adhere to the standard swim test rules required for safe participation on the inflatable obstacle course. All users would need to:

- Be 6 years of age and over
- Satisfactorily pass swim test:
  - Safely enter water without assistance
  - Swim approximately 25m safely
  - Summersault in the water, while demonstrating breath and body movement control
  - Tread water for 1 minute
  - Return to edge of pool and safely exit pool without assistance.
- Children 6-11 years of age must be supervised by responsible adult (additional to lifeguards)
- Follow all directions given by lifeguards and pool staff.

### Orange Youth Hub

The Orange Youth Hub has received a number of requests to hire the facility for various purposes. A proposed fee of \$12.50 per hour plus cleaning fees where applicable is sought.
